The scheme was launched in 2018 as part of a two-year pilot programme with the first year receiving positive feedback and engagement from the participants who took part. The scheme offers a fresh approach to how mentors and mentees are matched with the firm initially hosting a 'matching / speed networking' type evening at its London office, culminating in the option for all students to do work experience at the firm. The mentors from the firm will then provide quantifiable feedback to each student.
