We will also touch upon the latest developments in LPS and the next steps to implementation
- **Human Rights** - The Government has opened the consultation on the Human Rights Act review (closing 03 March 2022). We will examine the likely direction of travel and the headlines to be aware of to better inform any organisational response to this important call for evidence.
